Community Description

REGIONAL SETTING

The City of Madison Heights is located in the southeast corner of Oakland County, just west of the Macomb County border and about two miles north of Detroit. The city benefits from excellent regional connectivity, with freeway access provided by Interstate 75 (I-75) and Interstate 696 (I-696), making it a convenient location for commuters and businesses. Public transportation is also available through the Suburban Mobility Authority for Regional Transit (SMART) system, offering additional mobility options. As part of Oakland County, the second most populated county in Michigan, Madison Heights has experienced steady growth, with its strategic location attracting both employers and residents. According to the 2021 Land Use Survey, only 1.6% of the city's total acreage remains vacant, reflecting its development and economic vitality over the past 70 years.

HISTORY

Madison Heights sits on the ancestral lands of the Anishinaabe, specifically the Three Fires Confederacy of the Ojibwe, Odawa, and Potawatomi. Evidence of Native presence remains in the Red Run waterway and pre-settlement irrigation systems. In the 1830s, early settlers such as George Dawson, Archibald Lamphere, and Irish widow Elizabeth McBride began purchasing land. At that time, the Red Run River flowed through the area, but due to flooding and urban expansion, it was buried in the 20th century and incorporated into a storm and sanitary drain system. Madison Heights experienced significant growth during the 1950s and 1960s, reaching a peak population of 38,000 in 1970. Since then, the City has become mostly built out, and population has stabilized slightly below that peak as most available land for new housing was developed and average household size decreased. Although total population declined modestly, the number of housing units increased, resulting in more homes supporting smaller households —a trend illustrated in the population data from 2000 to 2025.

ECONOMICS

Economically, Madison Heights maintains a median household income of \$66,726, which is slightly below the Michigan average by \$2,457. Despite this, the city's poverty rate stands at 11.3%, which is lower than the state's 13.5% average. However, poverty disproportionately affects the most vulnerable populations, particularly children under 18 and seniors aged 65 and older. These statistics highlight the need for community programs that provide economic support and resources for lower-income families and elderly residents.

HOUSING

The city offers a mix of housing opportunities, with 63.8% of residents owning their homes. The median home value in Madison Heights is \$190,300, while the median gross rent is \$1,138, making rental housing relatively affordable compared to other areas. These statistics indicate a balanced housing market by offering both homeownership and rental options that cater to a range of economic situations.

THE PEOPLE OF MADISON HEIGHTS

Madison Heights is a diverse city with a population of approximately 28,238 residents. The community reflects a mix of racial and ethnic backgrounds, with 80% of residents identifying as White, 7.4% as Black or African American, 7.4% as Asian, and 3.6% as two or more races. The city is home to a significant foreign-born population, making up 14.2% of residents, and 15.9% of individuals over the age of five speak a language other than English at home—5.4% higher than the Michigan average. This linguistic and cultural diversity highlights the importance of multilingual resources in public services and education.

Madison Heights' parks and recreation system reflects the needs of its residents. With 10.5% of residents under 65 living with a disability and 4.6% identifying as veterans, accessibility and universal design remain central priorities. Parks and facilities are planned to ensure that individuals of all abilities, ages, and backgrounds can safely and comfortably participate in recreation. By creating inclusive environments and offering a variety of programs, the City aims to strengthen community connections and enhance quality of life through recreation.



RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE

This category has grown significantly since 1969, from 46 acres (1%) to 225 acres (6.2%). Major parks and recreation areas include the Red Oaks Golf Course; Red Oaks Water Park; Red Oaks Youth Soccer Complex; Suarez Friendship Woods and Nature Center (a Red Oaks facility beginning October 1, 2012); Rosie's Park/Madison Woods; and the Civic Center Park. In 2000, the City added 0.7 acres northeast of Rosie's Park and 1.5 acres at Suarez Friendship Woods. In 2009, the City added 0.42 acres at the southwest corner of Hales and Winthrop as a second expansion of Suarez Friendship Woods; and 1.0 acres at the southeast corner of Dartmouth and Dallas from the Madison Public Schools for Monroe Park. It should be noted that the entire Red Run right-of-way (137 acres) is included in this category.

PLAN FOCUS

This Parks and Recreation Master Plan addresses all City parks, recreation facilities, and programs. It focuses on serving both residents and visitors by enhancing opportunities for recreation, connection, and community enjoyment.

Administrative Structure

This section outlines how recreational activities and resources are governed and administered in the City of Madison Heights. It summarizes the roles of the various boards and departments responsible for recreation services.

GOVERNANCE

Overall authority for parks and recreation in Madison Heights rests with the City Council. The Council plays a critical role in the provision and oversight of recreation services. The Council appoints nine members to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, established under Chapter 19, Article III of the City's Code of Ordinances. This board serves solely in an advisory capacity. While it can recommend actions to the City Council, it does not hold legislative or administrative authority over parks and recreation operations. Its purpose is to advise and support, without limiting or replacing the responsibilities of parks and recreation supervisors.

Responsibility for implementing City Council policy decisions lies with the City Manager, who oversees the development and maintenance of park facilities and recreation programming. The City Manager has delegated this responsibility to the Director of Public Services.

Volunteers play a vital role by serving on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and the Active Adult Advisory Board.

SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Madison Heights is served primarily by two public school districts: Lamphere Schools and Madison District Public Schools. Additionally, a small portion of the city falls within the Royal Oak School District. The city is also home to Bishop Foley Catholic High School, a private institution. The City of Madison Heights partners with both Lamphere and Madison school districts to coordinate a variety of indoor programs. These programs are also held at other community facilities, including the Public Library, the Nature Center, and City Hall.

DEPARTMENTS

STREETS/FACILITIES DIVISION

Managed by a dedicated Coordinator, with staff from the Department of Public Services supporting all divisions as needed. The division oversees park capital projects and ongoing maintenance.



RECREATION DIVISION

Operated by two full-time staff members, along with numerous part-time employees, volunteers, and recreation program contractors. The division focuses on recreational and athletic programming for all ages and abilities.




ACTIVE ADULT CENTER DIVISION

Operated by two full-time staff members, supported by part-time employees, volunteers, and contractors. Programming focuses on residents aged 50+, offering activities ranging from overnight bus trips and food programs to exercise classes and bingo.

Funding Sources

All financial decisions related to the operation, improvement, and expansion of parks and recreation facilities within the City of Madison Heights are governed by the City Charter and must follow established budgetary and purchasing procedures.

APPROPRIATION AND BUDGET AUTHORITY

In accordance with Section 8.5 of the City Charter, no funds may be expended or obligated for parks and recreation purposes without a corresponding appropriation approved by the City Council. The City Manager is responsible for preparing and submitting an annual budget to the Council, which includes detailed funding recommendations for all city departments, including Parks and Recreation (Section 8.2). Only the City Council, by resolution, may transfer unencumbered funds between accounts or make additional appropriations during the fiscal year, provided such actions do not exceed actual and anticipated revenues.

GRANT ACCEPTANCE

City staff may pursue parks and recreation grants; however, only City Council may accept awards and commit matching funds or long-term obligations through the budget process or formal approval. All grant-funded projects must be included in or added to the city's annual budget before any funds are spent.

LAND ACQUISITION AND DISPOSITION

The purchase, sale, or lease of real estate—including parkland—requires the approval of City Council by an affirmative vote of at least five (5) members, as outlined in Section 12.1 of the City Charter. The City Manager is responsible for managing all city property transactions, but any acquisition of land for parks and recreation purposes must follow established purchasing procedures, including the solicitation of sealed bids and comparative pricing where applicable, unless exempted due to emergency circumstances or professional service requirements. Land designated as parkland may not be sold except in compliance with statutory restrictions.

PURCHASING AUTHORITY

The City Manager oversees all purchases related to city operations, including those for parks and recreation. For expenditures above the threshold set by ordinance, Council approval is required. All purchases must comply with competitive bidding requirements unless exempted under conditions outlined in the Charter (Section 12.1).


Parks and Recreation Inventory

The City of Madison Heights provides a diverse range of recreational facilities for residents and visitors. In addition to neighborhood parks, the City partners with Oakland County Parks to offer expanded amenities, including Red Oaks Park (formerly Ambassador Park), Red Oaks Nature Center (Friendship Woods), a dog park, golf course, and water park.

INVENTORY DEVELOPMENT

The park inventory was compiled internally by Parks and Recreation staff familiar with all City assets, recent improvements, and upcoming projects. No outside consultants were used. Roundtable discussions helped identify past accomplishments and future priorities. Each park listing includes amenities, accessibility rating, and a brief description.

School facilities serving Madison Heights students are also noted, as well as nearby Oakland and Macomb County parks that contribute to residents' recreational opportunities. Regional facilities such as the Huron-Clinton Metroparks and State Recreation Areas (all within about an hour's drive) offer additional amenities including swimming, camping, mountain biking, and boating.



ACCESSIBILITY ASSESSMENT

Accessibility and inclusion remain central to park planning and design in Madison Heights. Each park was evaluated to determine compliance with accessibility standards and to identify opportunities for improvement that support people of all ages and abilities. The Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) requires that a barrier-free ranking be assigned to every recreation facility, assessing both the accessibility of amenities and the routes that connect to them.

The following ranking system, established by the DNR's Guidelines for the Development of Community, Park, Recreation, Open Space, and Greenway Plans, was used to evaluate each park:



- 1 – None of the park meets accessibility guidelines
- 2 – Some areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 3 – Most areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 4 – Entire park meets accessibility guidelines
- 5 – Park developed or renovated using principles of universal design

Beyond compliance, the City is committed to fostering an inclusive park system that welcomes all users. This includes exploring sensory-friendly features, adaptive equipment, accessible trails, and community engagement efforts to better understand the needs of residents with disabilities. Accessibility goals and planned initiatives are outlined in the Goals and Objectives section starting on page 45.

PARTNERSHIP WITH OAKLAND COUNTY PARKS

The Interlocal Agreement between the City of Madison Heights and Oakland County Parks establishes a partnership for the cooperative development and ongoing maintenance of Friendship Woods Nature Center and Ambassador Park. The agreement outlines a 20-year term, ensuring a long-term commitment to preserve and enhance these public spaces. During this period, both parties agree to share responsibilities related to park operations, maintenance, and capital improvements. The agreement provides a framework for collaborative programming and stewardship while maintaining local control over daily operations. This partnership strengthens regional recreation opportunities and environmental conservation efforts for Madison Heights residents and the greater Oakland County community.







Status Report for all Grant-Assisted Parks and Recreation Facilities

The City of Madison Heights has received seven state recreation grants over the years that supported the development and improvement of local parks and public recreation spaces. While some of these projects date back several decades, the sites remain subject to the DNR's long-term use requirements for recreation purposes.

In the table below, each project is summarized with its scope of work and current status, including whether the site remains open to the public, if the grant-funded facilities are still present, and whether any conversions of use have occurred.

Planning and Public Input Process

The Madison Heights Recreation Master Plan was grounded in listening, collaboration, and broad community participation. From the beginning, the City committed to developing a plan that authentically reflects the lived experiences, priorities, and aspirations of its residents. This required moving beyond a single meeting or survey toward a sustained and inclusive engagement process that invited voices from across the community. Guided in part by the National Recreation and Park Association's (NRPA) framework for equity-based master planning, the City began with an internal review, most notably, a detailed accessibility assessment of park facilities. This study helped staff to better understand existing conditions and barriers.


Building on this foundation, the City engaged residents through a series of community events, workshops, and surveys designed to reach people where they are. City representatives attended more than nine events, from the Pre-4th of July Festival in the Park to the City's inaugural summer concert series, to gather meaningful feedback about how residents use and value their parks. Two formal public workshops, held on August 7 and September 29, provided opportunities for residents to review data, identify priorities, and shape the emerging vision for the system.

Importantly, progress toward accessibility and inclusion advanced even as the plan was being developed. For example, communication boards were installed in all city parks to support nonverbal communication and enhance inclusivity. Ultimately, Madison Heights embraced a planning approach rooted in fair access and community responsiveness. The resulting plan reflects Madison Heights' commitment to maintaining a parks and recreation system that is high-quality, accessible, and responsive to the diverse needs of its community.

OVERALL THEMES:

Four consistent themes emerged from all engagement efforts:

- **Comfort and Accessibility** – A strong desire for parks to include more shade, improve restrooms, and add additional seating to make spaces more comfortable and usable for all ages and abilities.
- **Cultural and Social Programming** – Interest in more events that bring the community together, including concerts, art shows, food festivals, and seasonal celebrations.
- **Diversified Amenities** – Requests for a wider range of recreation options, from pickleball courts and sand volleyball courts to nature trails and community gardens, balancing both active and passive uses.
- **Safety and Maintenance** – Calls to continue and strengthen efforts around facility upkeep, pathway lighting, and ensuring parks feel safe for all users.




ONLINE SURVEY

An online survey provided additional depth to the engagement process, drawing 818 responses—nearly 90% from Madison Heights residents across all age groups. Twenty-eight percent of respondents were between 26–35 years old, 32% between 36–50, and 16% between 51–65. About half had children living at home, ensuring that both family and non-family perspectives were reflected in the results.

Survey findings showed that 89% of respondents had visited a public park in the past year, with Civic Center Park, Rosie's Park, and Red Oaks Nature Center emerging as favorites. The most common barriers to greater park use were lack of time (54%), not knowing about available activities (44%), and a desire for more or different amenities (38%).


The survey was promoted widely through postcards, social media, the City website, and print media. It appeared in the City's quarterly newsletter that was mailed to most households in the city, and was a featured Madison-Park news article on June 20th. City staff also attended nine community events to hand out postcards with the survey link and to speak with residents. Additional postcards were distributed to accessibility-focused organizations like Healing Haven and The Creative Mobility Group to gather input from individuals with accessibility expertise.

SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGNS

The City launched a “This or That” social media campaign where residents voted between different parks and recreation options by liking or reacting to posts. The campaign saw strong participation, and a Tigers ticket giveaway encouraged residents to complete the community survey.



WORKSHOPS:

City staff hosted two engaging public workshops to guide the future of parks and recreation. The first, focused on accessibility, featured a presentation and interactive activity where participants used sticky notes on printed park maps to share ideas and accessibility challenges. The second centered on data and goal development, allowing residents to review findings and provide feedback on proposed priorities.

Goals and Objectives

The following seven goals and objectives are based on findings from the parks inventory, public engagement, and community survey. Each goal is outlined on the following pages with defined outputs (measurable actions or deliverables) and outcomes, which describe broader community impacts. Both recreation and park goals are prioritized, with an action plan at the end detailing current and projected budget allocations.

1. Prioritize maintenance and enhancement of all existing parks and features.
1.1 Develop a long-range capital replacement plan for existing capital outlay equipment, trails, and facilities for ongoing maintenance and replacement.
1.2 Evaluate signage at all parks and determine sign replacements to create branding uniformity, incorporate accessibility, and provide relevant information.
1.3 Review and plan routes to minimize gaps connecting neighborhoods to parks for pedestrians and bikers.
2. Advance opportunities for passive recreation for a wide range of individuals and age groups.
2.1 Incorporate passive recreation into the design and function of City facilities where appropriate by providing amenities such as walking trails, benches, and picnic facilities.
2.2 Enhance opportunities for passive recreation by developing accessible green spaces that include shaded seating areas, quiet zones, and reflective environments to support relaxation and well-being for individuals of all ages and abilities.
2.3 Identify land areas adjacent to existing parks and open spaces that provide logical expansion opportunities for green space or facility enhancement.
3. Provide opportunities for active recreation for a wide range of individuals and age groups
3.1 Develop and maintain recreation facilities that are safe, accessible, and inclusive for all ages and abilities by regularly assessing facility conditions, pursuing accessibility focused upgrades, and expanding adaptive recreation opportunities.
3.2 Develop and maintain playgrounds, playfields, and recreation facilities that reflect the needs of the City's population by evaluating usage patterns, conducting community input every five years, and ensuring facilities are updated to meet current recreation and safety standards.
3.3 Initiate and lead a collaborative dialogue with neighboring communities and Oakland County Parks, to explore the development of a jointly operated community and recreation center that serves residents of all ages and abilities.
4. Create recreation programs that are suited to the City's current and anticipated population.
4.1 Conduct annual program reviews to evaluate effectiveness, promote continuous improvement, and ensure alignment with community needs and responsible fiscal practices.
4.2 Regularly assess and update all program offerings to ensure they remain affordable, accessible, and reflective of the community's diverse interests—supporting both active and passive recreation.
4.3 Strengthen partnerships with schools, community organizations, and regional recreation providers to expand diverse program opportunities, increase efficient use of shared facilities, and deliver cost-effective recreation services that benefit residents across the community and neighboring areas.
4.4 Expand year-round recreational offerings by introducing more outdoor programs, including unique opportunities not currently available in the community.

5. Improve safety and sense of security for park users
5.1 Upgrade and replace existing regular park lighting and deteriorating baseball field lights at Rosie's Park, Huffman Park, and Silverleaf Park with new energy-efficient fixtures to enhance visibility, improve security, and increase park user safety.
5.2 Evaluate the need for additional lighting installations along pathways of frequently used parks.
5.3 Conduct an accessibility review of the top-utilized City parks to identify opportunities to increase barrier-free access to facilities.
5.4 Develop a safety plan for monitoring parks, including expanding police and park ranger presence.
6. Create a community engagement communication plan to increase awareness of Parks and Programming.
6.1 Identify ways to improve public awareness and understanding of parks and recreation offerings, with an emphasis on accessible features, through outreach, education, and promotion.
6.2 Host recreation and community events across all parks to showcase unique amenities, promote public awareness, and enhance safety through greater community presence.
6.3 Develop a stewardship and volunteer program within the Parks and Recreation Department to improve park maintenance, assist with programming and special events, and create community.
7. Ensure long-term sustainability of the Park and Recreation system







Q4 How many children, if any, currently live in your household?



Q5 How often did you visit the following parks last year?



Q6 Are your primary recreational activities passive or active?





Q8 How would you rate the following in our community?







Q13 Which do you prefer for skill levels in parks and recreation programs?



Q14 Which do you prefer for recreation activities?



Q15 Which do you prefer for the types of programs offered?



Q16 Some amenities (like splash pads, skate parks, farmers markets, etc.) are available in nearby communities. Madison Heights should...






